Opening Questions

- 1. Describe the characteristics of a mature person.
- 2. Why does humility tend to be more attractive than arrogance?
- 3. In conversations with other people, what topics do you tend to disagree on the most? Why? What happens when those sensitive topics come up?

- 1. What was mentioned in the weekend message that you would like to learn more about?
- 2. Read I Corinthians 2:1 through 3:4.
- 3. How does Paul describe his approach to the Corinthians in 2:1-5? How is this difficult or important?
- 4. Refer to 2:6-13. Why did the leaders during Jesus' time fail to understand who He was?
- 5. According to the above verses, how would you identify a mature Christian?
- 6. Refer to 2:14-3:4. Why does strife reflect spiritual immaturity among Christians?
- 7. How does Paul describe a life controlled and led by the Holy Spirit in these verses?

Making It Personal

- 1. Since freedom from jealousy and quarreling are marks of Christian maturity, how would you evaluate your own maturity in Christ?
- 2. Using this same standard, how mature is Pathway Church?
- 3. Describe what growth areas you have regarding adopting "the mind of Christ" and looking for the wisdom of Christ in your life.
- 4. Spend time in prayer for each other and for Pathway Church—health, growth, and and becoming more like Jesus.

Continued Learning
