Opening Questions

- 1. Have you ever seen or been part of a conflict regarding public worship in the church? What was it about? How do you determine what is appropriate in public worship?
- 2. Is the experience you have in corporate worship geared more toward private growth or building up the entire body? Expand on your answer.
- 3. What questions would you have liked to ask Paul about chapter 11? What questions do you have for Pastor Hutchison regarding his weekend message?

In the Word

- 1. Read the following in 1 Corinthians 11.
- 2. Verses 11:2-16: What is the basic issue Paul is addressing?
- 3. Verses 11:11-12: How does Paul note differences between men and women while still affirming their interdependence?
- 4. Verses 11:23-34: How does Paul describe the meaning and importance of The Lord's Supper?
- 5. Verse 11:27: Discuss how this meal was being abused.
- 6. According to what Paul says, how are worship priorities supposed to be shaped by believers in worship and unbelievers coming to worship? Why is this important?

Making It Personal

- 1. Considering the content of chapter 11, how do you think God wants your attitude, actions, and approach to worship to change? What changes would you encourage Pathway Church?
- 2. What, if any, changes in approach or attitude regarding the Lord's Supper are needed?
- 3. How could your approach to worship be geared more toward the entire body of believers and not just private worship?
- 4. Personally and corporately, what considerations need to be made for believers and unbelievers in weekly corporate worship at Pathway Church?

Continued Learning

- 1. As a Home Team, spend time in worship together (prayer, singing, silence, communion, etc.).
- 2. Pray for Pathway Church—for weekly worship that honors and pleases God and benefits the entire church and individuals.
