

Opening Questions

- 1. Describe your favorite or most memorable *Game Changer* moment from the world of sports.
- 2. What other life events would you describe as *Game Changers* (home, work, church, relationships, career, etc.) and why?

In the Word

- 1. Read John 14:1-6 and Luke 9:23-26.
- 2. In John 14:1-6, Jesus is comforting his disciples after talking about His own betrayal, suffering, and death. In what ways do Jesus' words in verses 1-6 bring comfort to his disciples?
- 3. How many clear promises are there in John 14:1-6 from Jesus? What are they?
- 4. In Luke 9:23-26 Jesus is trying to explain that following Him will not be easy. What do you think it means to deny yourself and take up your cross daily to follow Jesus?
- 5. Verse 24 is a classic paradox from Jesus, how would you restate it in your own words?
- 6. Take a few minutes individually, or in smaller groups, to restate verses 25 and 26 in your own words?
- 7. In what ways do verses 24-26 appear harsh and hard-hitting for Jesus' followers?

Making It Personal

- 1. In what kinds of things have you invested significant money, time, or life, that don't really involve Jesus and won't last?
- 2. Denying ourselves and carrying His cross means death. In what simple or significant ways does God want you to say "No" to yourself in order to say "Yes" to Him?
- 3. What are simple conveniences you are reluctant to give up even though it would lead to following Jesus more closely (attending church, use of money, use of time, possessions, etc.)?
- 4. Spend time in prayer as a group—pray for the *Game Changers* series to lead to deeper and more impactful following of Jesus for each group member, family, and Pathway Church.
