Living Like Nobody Else, Part 2

WEEK 4 • JUDGES 6-7

OPENING QUESTIONS

- 1. Share a time when you tried something really different that challenged you.
- 2. Have you ever experienced a time when you expected help or support and you wound up alone or almost alone?

IN THE WORD

- Judges 6-7 portray Gideon's growth from an average Israelite into a spirit-led deliverer. Read Judges 6:36-40. Is this intended as an act of faith (that we should imitate) or a request out of insecurity? Is there any indication of how God felt about his request?
- 2. Judges 7:2 explains God's reason for thinning out of Gideon's army from 32,000 to 300. Do you think this would affect how God tolerated or addressed fear in those who remained?
- 3. Judges 7:2-3 indicates that the majority of men with Gideon were afraid of the upcoming battle. When God addresses the subject of Gideon's confidence/fear in Judges 7:10, what do Gideon's actions reveal about his attitude?
- 4. God causes Israel's enemies to panic in confusion. Discuss what contribution each of the following would add to that confusion:
 - a. All 300 carry a trumpet (normally, only a few men in an army would carry a trumpet).
 - b. They attack in darkness.
 - c. They attack just after the changing of the watch (Judges 7:19).
 - d. Their enemies were composed of several different peoples (Judges 7:12).

MAKING IT PERSONAL

- 1. To what extent do you lean toward "being like everyone else" or "living extraordinarily?"
- 2. Consider a time when you may have experienced a God-sized venture. Did you experience it by joining forces with others or did you do it alone?
- 3. What challenges are in front of you that would be better handled by joining with others rather than doing it by yourself?
- 4. We see both victories and failures in Gideon's life just as we see in our own lives. Take a few minutes to consider and share with the group what you have learned from both.
- 5. In Judges 6-7, we witness God patiently coaxing Gideon into a life of extraordinary faith and obedience. What areas do you think God is trying to grow you?

CONTINUED LEARNING

Judges 8:22-35 focuses on Gideon's legacy—the remainder of his life after the major battles and the events that took place after his death. Judges 9 tells the account of Gideon's son, Abimelech. After reading these passages, what insights does it provide about Gideon, his family, and the people of Israel at that time?
