Pursuit Over Persuasion

WEEK 6 • JUDGES 11

OPENING QUESTION

Share about a time you made a commitment to God that you did not keep.

IN THE WORD

- 1. Judges 10:6-9 tells us how Israel retuned again to foreign gods. These were gods of self-indulgence and pleasure. How is this similar to the world today?
- 2. We read in Judges 10:10-16 that the people cried out to the Lord after being tormented by the Philistines and Ammonites. At first, God does not seem to heed their cry (vs.11-13) but rebukes them. Then, in verse 16, we read, God will act to rescue them again. What happens in verses 10-16 to bring about a change from the God? What is the lesson in this message?
- 3. The elders of Gilead rejected Jephthah because of something beyond his control and who his mother was. Yet, when they needed his expertise as a military leader, they called him. How would you rate Jephthah's response to the elders on a scale of 1 to 10 (1=bad, and 10=great) in Judges 11:7-10? Why?
- 4. How is Jephthah trying to manipulate the Ammonite king in Judges 11:24 (see Deuteronomy 2:21) and even God in Judges 11:29-32? What is the solution that you learned both last week and this week from these passages?
- 5. How does Philippians 1:9-11 help us understand the statement, "Chose to pursue God not persuade Him?"

MAKING IT PERSONAL

- 1. How do we avoid living like those around us in self-indulgence?
- 2. Have you ever heard someone say, "Everyone else is doing it and it is not a big deal" because they knew it was not a good thing. Based on this week's message, how could you respond to that statement?
- 3. Have you ever felt rejection like Jepthah? How does God help us with rejection?
- 4. What are some ways we try to persuade God with "our ways" rather than just follow His ways?
- 5. Share with your Home Team one way you intentionally pursue God.

CONTINUED LEARNING

Read Psalm 2 and pick out ways to draw close to God. When you feel distant from God, you can read any Psalm to discover how David drew close God.
