OPENING QUESTIONS

- 1. If you could choose any job for one year, what would it be?
- 2. How would you summarize your work ethic as a teenager?

IN THE WORD

- 1. Read Titus 2:9-10 and list some of the encouragements on how we should act at home and workplace.
- 2. Titus 2:9 says, "teach slaves to be subject to their masters in everything." Name ways Christians should or should not apply this to their work place situations.
- 3. Read Colossians 3:17. How can you apply this passage to an unfair or unappreciative boss? How about with an unkind or difficult co-worker?
- 4. In Colossians 1:18 we read that Christ is the head of the body, the church, so that in everything He might have supremacy. How can we apply this verse to how we behave at work?
- 5. Joseph was not always treated fairly for many years but eventually he received high position of management. What do you see in Genesis 41:37-43 that allowed this to happen? How might you see that lived out in your life?

MAKING IT PERSONAL

- 1. Name some ways we can show integrity at work or home.
- 2. Pastor Todd mentioned having a submissive heart of service. What could that look like in your place of work or home?
- 3. What does it mean to be fully trusted at work or home?
- 4. With a prayer partner, share a way that you can apply this scripture in the coming week to make the teaching of Jesus look attractive.
